About the Scholarships: The Library is offering this scholarship opportunity to students in the fields of history and library science. Senior or graduate students in history and graduate students in a library science program are encouraged to apply. Depending on area of interest, there will be opportunities to gain experience in archival processing and organization, or in the field of cataloging and library operations. This is a learning/service scholarship, which means that students will have the opportunity not only to be awarded the scholarship, they will also be learning in a real-world environment about archival and library processes.

Amount and Duration: \$500/academic term for 1 term. Applicants may reapply for subsequent terms. In exchange, awardees will be expected to work at the Lloyd Library for 15 hours/month during the award period. This affords students a hands-on learning experience, which can assist later on in job placement in their chosen career field. Students will be mentored by an appropriate professional member of the Lloyd Library Staff.

How to apply: Applicants should include the following:

1. 250-500 word essay on why they want to be an archivist or librarian and why they want to work at the Lloyd Library and with its collections. Please include complete contact information, including email and preferred telephone.
2. TWO letters of reference from professors or others who know your abilities and can speak to your qualifications
3. Official transcripts from your current school.

About the Lloyd: The Lloyd Library and Museum is a scientific research library in downtown Cincinnati. The Library holds, acquires, preserves, and provides access to both historic and current books and journals, as well as archival materials, on a wide variety of disciplines that fall under the subjects of natural history, botany, pharmacy, and medicine. Lloyd's resources are an eclectic blend of a host of related sciences. Despite the scientific focus, the collections have relevance to the humanities, such as visual arts and foreign languages through resources that feature botanical illustrations, original artworks, and travel literature. The Lloyd is open to the public—and all are invited to explore this unique establishment.
