

Emma Rouse Lloyd Papers, 1858-1932
Collection No. 7



Abstract

The collection consists of the genealogical and historical materials gathered to write the book Clasping Hands With Generations Past. Included are correspondence, books and pamphlets, and interviews. Also includes financial records in regard to research by various genealogists.

Biographical Sketch

Emma Rouse Lloyd was born on April 11, 1858, into a prominent Northern Kentucky family. The daughter of Thomas Rouse and Nancy Ann Henderson, she was educated at White Haven, a private school, and another private school in Crittenden. She attended Sayre Institute in Lexington for her secondary education. Married to John Uri Lloyd on June 10, 1880, Ms. Rouse became a support and homemaker for her husband, while being involved in many civic, religious and social organizations. She bore three children, a son John Thomas, and two daughters, Anna Lloyd Welbourn and Dorothy Lloyd Brett.

Emma Rouse Lloyd grew up with a keen interest in the history of her family, and her efforts to compile a genealogy resulted in her book. Not satisfied with a listing of family members, she worked hard to discover stories about the people, to give them a human dimension. Emma also assisted John Uri Lloyd in several of his literary efforts. Ms. Lloyd took the photographs which were used in Stringtown On The Pike, and it was on her advice that John Uri included a woman in his first novel, Etidorpha. That character was, of course, Etidorpha, and the book was titled after the character. And it was due solely to the efforts of Emma that John Uri finished the sequel to Stringtown On The Pike that had begun just after that work's publication. Titled Our Willie, the work was completed in 1934 because of the promise to Emma, in the months before her death, to finish the book.

Emma Rouse Lloyd died November 27, 1932. Her book had been published the previous August, having been greatly hurried through its final editing and publication stages by her

husband. Emma signed but one copy, that to her husband John Uri Lloyd.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of correspondence, drafts of Clasping Hands With Generations Past, genealogical research notes, biographical items, miscellaneous books and publications, and materials from various organizations of which Emma Lloyd was a member.
