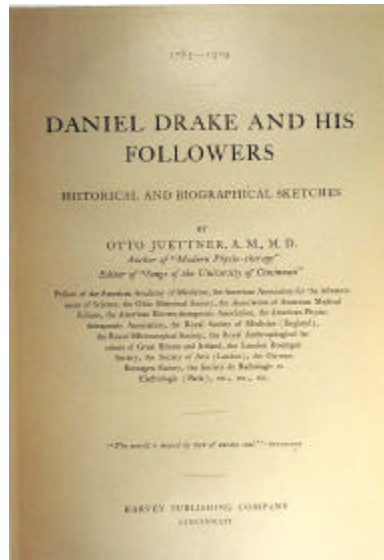


**Otto Juettner Papers, 1865-1922**  
Collection No. 9



Abstract

The collection consists of the materials gathered by Juettner for his works on the history of medicine in Cincinnati. Consists primarily of subject materials on doctors and events in Cincinnati, the Old Northwest, and history of medicine in general. Also contains many of the literary works of Juettner.

Biographical Sketch

Otto Juettner was a primary force in the development of the study of the history of medicine in Cincinnati. A noted physician in his own right, Juettner was also a noted historian. He was born in Nimptsch, near Breslau, Germany, on February 3, 1865 to Amandus and Augusta (Haenel) Juettner. His preparatory education was at St. Mathias Gymnasium, Breslau, and Grandducal Lyceum, Karlsruhe, Germany.

Juettner came to America in 1881. He received an A.B. from St. Xavier College, Cincinnati, in 1885, and a Sc.M. in 1891. In 1888, he received his M.D. from the Medical College of Ohio. He practiced medicine in Cincinnati. Juettner was appointed attending physician at Seton Hospital; was made director of the Cincinnati Post-Graduate School of Physical Therapy in 1903; professor of clinical Medicine and Physical Therapeutics in the Cincinnati Polyclinic and Post-Graduate School, 1909 to 1920.

Juettner married Estelle Regina Bode in 1913. He continued active practice in Cincinnati, excepting the period from 1915, when he was appointed 1st Lieutenant in the Medical Reserve Corps, USA. In 1917, he was made a captain. His writings include Daniel Drake and His Followers, 1909, biographical works on John L. Richmond, 1913, and Alexander Dunlap, 1913, Treatise on the Practice of Medicine Based on Therapeutic Methods, 1915, and miscellaneous

articles in medical and historical journals. Otto Juettner died on August 23, 1922.
